

- Upper End and the Avenue for one day between Sunday 17th and Sunday 24th March, and a further day between Friday 12th and Tuesday 30th April.
- Eckington Bridge for 16 days from Saturday 23rd March until Sunday 7th April.

Reason: Phase 1: Pre surface dressing patching by WCC. **Phase 2:** Carriageway surface dressing and sweeping, lining and <u>cats</u> eyes by WCC.



Road Closure – Upper End, The Avenue and Church Lane (March/April)

Upper End and the Avenue, from the junction with Defford Road to the junction with Whitehall Lane, and Church Lane, will be closed for one day between 17th and 24th March, and a further day between 12th and 30th April. This is to allow for pre surface dressing and carriageway surface dressing.

The notice of closure and the diversion map are shown opposite.



Eckington Bridge Closure

Saturday 23rd March - Sunday 7th April

Eckington Bridge will be closed for maintenance for 16 days from Saturday 23rd March until Sunday 7th April.

The official diversion between Birlingham and Eckington is shown as a route via Tewkesbury and Upton Upon Severn but obviously the quickest route is through Pershore and Nafford.

The notice of closure is given opposite.

Proposed Order: to close that part of B4080 Pershore Road from its junction with C2271 New Barn Lane to its junction with U46445 Roman Meadow.
